What is a newt? Well, for us here at NEIWT, it's our new bi-monthly newsletter! Welcome to our first issue!

In nature, a newt is a type salamander with a unique life cycle. Like other amphibians, newts begin their lives in the water as tadpoles with gills. Most amphibians only leave the water as adults, but newts morph into a land-dwelling juvenile stage when they develop legs, lungs, and bright red or orange skin that serves as a warning to predators that it contains toxins. In this phase, they are called red efts, and they travel long distances through the woods in search of new breeding ponds. Then they return to the water and morph again into aquatic adults with olive green skin. Newts are common throughout Indiana's forests, lakes, and streams, and they eat invertebrates like mosquito larvae. And for that, on behalf of all paddlers, we say, "Thank you, newts!"

OUR MISSION

Northeast Indiana Water Trails: Bringing the Rivers into Your Life!

The Northeast Indiana Water Trails is a regional partnership working to increase recreation opportunities on our waterways by promoting boat access, water safety and stewardship, and the development of regional water trails that will empower our citizens to become more active in our water resources.

NEIWT was formed in 2015 after a group of individuals from throughout the region got together to talk about how to activate the rivers in NE Indiana. There was discussion on improving water quality, increasing access for man-powered water recreation, disseminating information about water safety and quality, improving the safety of the rivers for water sports, and connecting the community to the 566 miles of flowing waters in the 10-county NE Indiana region. Forging forward, we sought assistance from the National Park Service: Rivers, Trails, and Conservation Assistance Program to help with our strategic plan to give us a vision for the future of water trails in NE Indiana! OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Since its inception, the partnership has had several successes including:

- Developing a waterproof water trail map for the Western Lake Erie Basin in IN, available at Fort Wayne Outfitters and Bike Depot, Steady Eddy's in Leo, and Visit Fort Wayne (\$5 suggested donation).
- Coordinating the installation of two new public boat access sites and making improvements to another.
- Hosting our 8th annual Pedal, Paddle, Play, our yearly fundraiser and community event to encourage more people to experience NE Indiana's water trails.
- Providing education and outreach at community events for all ages regarding water quality, safe water recreation, and the benefits of outdoor recreation.
- Assisting dam owners with installation of warning signs about the dangers of low head dams through our #damdangerous signage program.
- Partnering with land owners and municipalities throughout the region to install trailhead signs at public access sites providing wayfinding, safety, and interpretive information.
- Providing a one-stop-shop for all things paddling in NE Indiana at <u>neiwatertrails.com</u> (including an interactive water trail map!).

- Developing twelve trailhead signs for put-in sites on the Wabash and Eel rivers
- Planning our 2024 social and fundraising events.



Thank you to everyone who participated this year and helped us raise over \$4,000 for the water trails!




